Get Dead Set on August 8

Dying to Know Day culminating on August 8 encourages Australians to 'get dead set' by having conversations about end-of-life planning.

The national annual campaign aims to improve death literacy among individuals and communities to reshape the way we approach death, dying and end-of-life planning.

The 2024 Dying to Know Day theme is focused on the role of community in fostering conversations around death and dying, encouraging individuals to consider and talk about their own unique wishes for end of life.

Research shows that while 9 in 10 (87%) Australians believe it is important to do some end-of-life planning, only 1 in 3 (35%) have actually taken action. **Many individuals still face barriers to taking action as the topic is often associated with stigma and people aren't able to access the right tools and resources.**

By encouraging communities with the knowledge and resources they need to facilitate supportive conversations on end-of-life care and planning, the *Dying to Know Day* campaign is not only breaking down the stigma that is associated with death, dying and grief. **The campaign is also aiming to encourage individualism for people thinking and deciding about their own end of life wishes.**

Jessie Williams, Community Programs Manager at Proveda - the organisation behind *Dying to Know Day*, said, **"While most Australians recognise the importance of planning for end-of-life, many individuals and communities still face barriers when it comes to understanding what this means, taking action or starting a conversation around death and dying. This often leads to end-of-life experiences being misaligned with an individual's values,**



preferences or wishes, because they simply don't know what is available or what they can request or expect."

"Building communities that can foster these types of conversation is a critical step in ensuring all Australians have access to the tools and environment they need to plan for end of life. This will help individuals feel supported in talking about their personal wishes for their own final arrangements, and can help break down the misconception that end of life planning is something to be done alone" says Jessie.

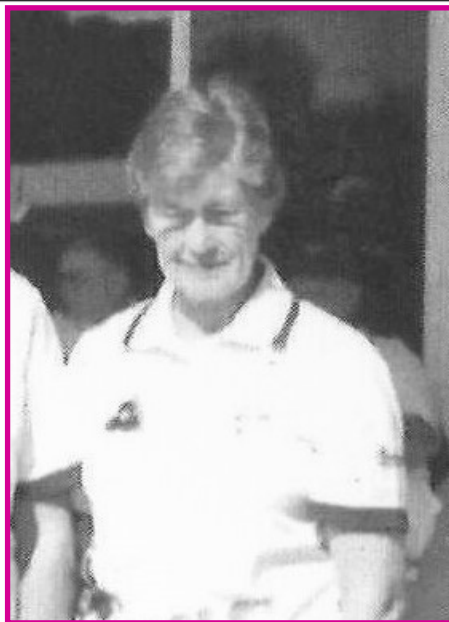
Being community minded she was also sporting and meticulous in book keeping. Her love of her life were her cats and a cockatoo she inherited. Much respected by all who knew her.

My council, my vote



You must be enrolled to vote

A general election for Central Goldfields Shire Council will be held in October 2024. To be able to vote in the election, you must be enrolled by the close of roll at **4 pm on Wednesday 7 August 2024**. Two categories of voters can be enrolled to vote in the Central Goldfields Shire Council election: State-enrolled voters and Council-enrolled voters.

State-enrolled voters

Am I enrolled to vote?

You are automatically enrolled for this election if:

- you will be 18 years of age or over on Saturday 26 October 2024 and
- you live in Central Goldfields Shire and you are on the State electoral roll for your current address.

You need to enrol if:

- you are an Australian citizen aged 18 or over on Saturday 26 October 2024 and
- you live in Central Goldfields Shire and you are not on the State electoral roll or
- you have lived at your current residential address within Central Goldfields Shire for at least a month and have not yet updated your enrolment details, including any changes to your postal address.

How do I enrol?

You can enrol online at vec.vic.gov.au

You can also download an enrolment form from the website.

All enrolment applications must be received by the Victorian Electoral Commission by the close of roll at **4 pm on Wednesday 7 August 2024**.

How can I check my State enrolment?

You can check your enrolment details online at vec.vic.gov.au at any time, or call 131 832.

Thinking about standing for election?

To nominate as a candidate for Central Goldfields Shire Council, you must:

- be an Australian citizen and enrolled on the voters' roll for Central Goldfields Shire Council and
- be eligible to become a councillor and
- have completed the mandatory candidate training provided by Local Government Victoria before lodging your nomination with the Election Manager.

State-enrolled voters can register for free VoterAlert SMS and email reminders at vec.vic.gov.au

Council-enrolled voters

Am I enrolled to vote?

To be a Council-enrolled voter, you must be:

- 18 years of age or over on Saturday 26 October 2024 and
- not a State-enrolled voter within Central Goldfields Shire.

New rules mean you are no longer automatically enrolled if you are a non-resident property owner (e.g. a landlord or a business owner that pays rates). If you are a non-resident property owner within Central Goldfields Shire, you need to apply to enrol if you wish to vote in the Central Goldfields Shire Council election.

Who else can enrol & vote?

You may also apply to enrol if:

- you have purchased a rateable property within Central Goldfields Shire since the last election but you are not a resident of Central Goldfields Shire, or
- you are not an Australian citizen and you live in, and pay rates for, a property within Central Goldfields Shire, or
- you pay rates on a property you occupy within Central Goldfields Shire and have no other voting entitlement within Central Goldfields Shire, for example you are a shop tenant and pay rates to the Council for your tenancy, and you have no other voting entitlement within Central Goldfields Shire, or
- you are a director or company secretary of a corporation within Central Goldfields Shire that pays rates to Central Goldfields Shire Council and you have no other voting entitlement within Central Goldfields Shire.

How do I apply to be a Council-enrolled voter?

If you meet any of the above criteria and wish to enrol, contact Central Goldfields Shire Council on 5461 0610 for a council enrolment form. Council enrolment forms must be received by the Council by the close of roll at **4 pm on Wednesday 7 August 2024**.

As a Councillor and indeed Mayor, I must say that I'm still 'glowing' in the news that Deledio Rec Reserve's new pavilion upgrade project was successful in obtaining \$1 Million worth of State funding in the Regional Community Sports Infrastructure Fund.

This particular project has been high on my list of priorities and advocacy for the whole four years I've been Flynn Ward Councillor. I've attended many community meetings and it has been front and centre in any discussion I've had with local members of parliament, both at state and federal levels.

Council has committed to future borrowings of the remainder to build the pavilion in full, however there is another live funding application for \$2 million with the Federal Government at present - through the Play Our Way Fund (POWF) program. If this is successful as well, then Council borrowings will be reduced by \$2 million.

I am so proud of the Dunolly community for not losing the vision and drive to push for this pavilion for over 20 years! The hard work has finally paid off.

This new pavilion will not be just another 'sporting facility' - far from it. It'll be a multi-use facility the whole township and surrounds can access and enjoy. The pavilion will also build on the new multi-use sports courts that were opened up a little while ago. I don't have a time frame for completion as yet, but as with all grant funding, there will be a cut off to complete the works - so watch this space!

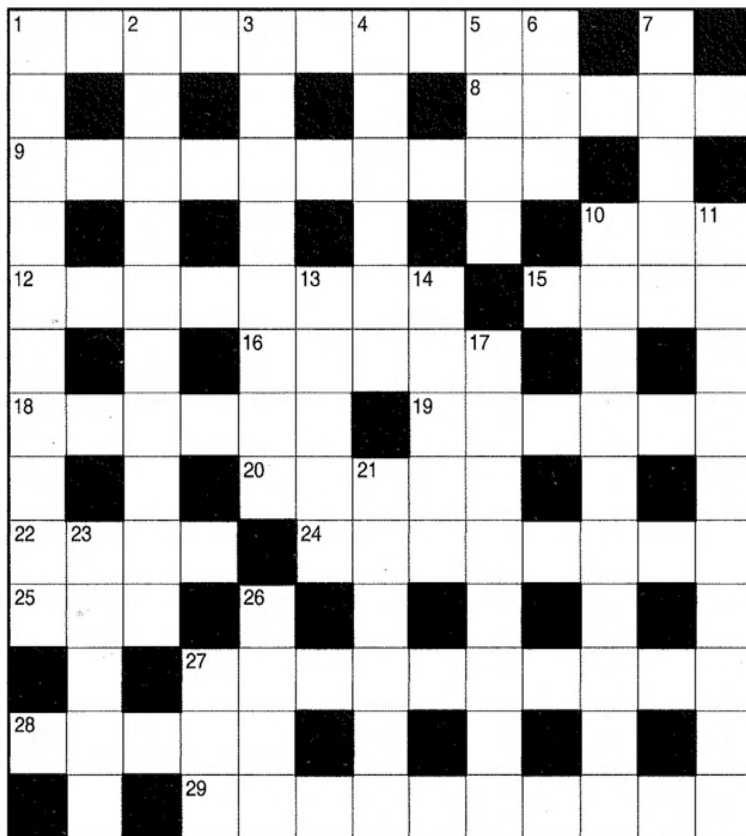
