

Beyond the Garden Path with Maz.....



Spring has sprung! And so have the millions of weeds; even some that I've not had before. The seeds could have been lying dormant in the ground for years just waiting for such an opportunity as we've had this year.

We virtually went from summer into a cold, cold winter with perfect lots of soaking rain, while the ground held a lot more heat than usual. And then, of course, there was quite a bit of strong wind to carry goodness knows what, to drop into our yards. As a consequence, fertility in spades! But let's not get too bogged down in dreariness, because look at what we've got now and will have more of soon. Vibrancy and colour!

Our whole countryside has had a good drink, which was more than overdue. A few of the farm dams are now full

from virtually uninterrupted flows, but a lot of the bush dams are still way down, even with good catchments, as there are a lot of thirsty trees out there to drink it all up. However, fingers crossed.

My yard has been full of birds. Blue wrens have been gone for nearly two weeks, so I take it that they have been nesting somewhere. Thank goodness it is not in my yard though, as two lots of babies got taken by cats three seasons ago. I was absolutely gutted! I would be more than happy if the owners of these cats were to keep them home where they belong. They not only kill the birds, lizards, frogs etc, but also use my vegie garden as a toilet while on their overnight ramblings.

I think it's more than time the Shire put in a cat curfew. Look at all the extra funds they'd raise!! But I have a suspicion that, miraculously, these moggies wouldn't belong to anyone at all in that case.

Anyway, getting back to the birds that do come around. We have lots of quite tame magpies that mostly manage to look after themselves. I've had three olive-backed orioles in the trees at the back. They have choruses of many notes. Also quite a few different honey-eaters and parrots. It's great to hear them all singing and chattering at once.

The little pardalotes are also around, but hard to catch sight of as they are so tiny. I wonder where they nest, as they build little hollows like burrows out in the countryside.

Anyone interested in wildflowers

should be out and about in the bush over the next few months as it's going to be a show out of the ordinary. Apparently it's the same around most of Australia. Wouldn't it be nice to be able to take a day-trip into the outback to see carpets of colour?

I've also noticed that for the second year in a row we seem to have more bees than usual. That's got to be a good sign as well!

Anyway, take time to wander around and enjoy the overall spread of our wonderful wild, bush gardens, as well as our own patches.

Call for candidates

Nominations to stand as a candidate for the 2016 Central Goldfields and Loddon Shire Council elections open on Thursday 15 September.

'I encourage anyone interested in representing their local community to nominate,' said Returning Officers Jenny Campbell for Loddon Shire and Robyn Walker for Central Goldfields Shire.

'Prospective candidates should prepare now so they are ready to lodge their nomination in person during the short nomination period.'

Nomination forms must be lodged in person, together with the \$250 nomination fee, with the Returning Officer during business hours from Thursday 15 September until 12 noon Tuesday 20 September at the Loddon Shire election office: Council Chambers, 37 Peppercorn Way, Serpentine; or the Central Goldfields Shire election office: Community Hub Rooms 1-3,12-22 Nolan St, Maryborough.

Late nominations cannot be accepted.

To prepare, prospective candidates can call the Returning Officer from Wednesday 14 September on 1300 583 870 for Loddon Shire or 1300591299 for Central Goldfields, to make a nomination appointment. They can also pre-fill their nomination form online using the VEC's Candidate Helper at wec.vic.gov.au

Prospective candidates are also strongly encouraged to attend a candidate information session. An information session will be held:

Nominations

To nominate, a person must be:

- enrolled as a voter for Loddon Shire/Central Goldfields Shire Council elections (this includes council-enrolled voters who may be non-residents)
- an Australian citizen or qualified British subject not otherwise disqualified under the Local Government Act 1989.

Candidates can stand for election for any ward, even if their enrolled address is in a different ward within the council.

Further nomination information is available at vec.vic.gov.au where prospective candidates can download a copy of the *Candidate Handbook* to familiarise themselves with the key requirements and responsibilities of nominating.

Elected candidates will represent their local community on Council for a fixed term of four years.

Voting

The Loddon Shire and Central Goldfields Shire Council elections will be conducted by postal vote. Ballot packs will be mailed to all enrolled voters between 4 and 6 October. Ballot packs will not be mailed to voters in any uncontested wards.

Loddon Shire Council is divided into five single-councillor wards. Central Goldfields Shire is divided into

one four-councillor ward and three single-councillor wards, with a total of seven councillors.

Voters will complete a ballot paper listing the candidates for their ward. Voting is compulsory for voters who were on the State roll for this election at 4 pm Friday 26 August 2016—State-enrolled voters who don't vote may be fined. Voters aged 70 years or older and council-enrolled voters are encouraged to vote, but will not be fined if they don't vote.

Sam and Jenny Bailey a hit in Central Victoria

Farmer, pilot, husband, and bestselling author Sam Bailey had a lasting impact on residents young and old when he and wife Jenny visited Central Victoria on a speaking tour last week.

During a busy week, Sam and Jenny visited three towns and eight schools speaking to 150 farmers and community members, and 400 primary and secondary students in St Arnaud, Navarre, Dunolly and Maryborough.

Tour organiser Belinda Pritchard from Agriculture Victoria said Sam's story had inspired all his audiences.

"Sam talked about his life, from a childhood growing up in the Australian bush, to a car accident in the outback that turned his life upside down, and its aftermath," Ms Pritchard said.

"He showed the great Australian spirit of having a go and told how he beat the odds to fulfill his lifelong dream to be a farmer, learning to ride a four-wheel motorbike, devising a hoist to get into farm machinery and ultimately learning to fly an ultralight.

He also revealed his big goal – "Sam becoming the first quadriplegic in the world to fly a helicopter."

Ms Pritchard said Sam captivated the audiences he spoke to and captured the attention of students from Prep to Year 12, sharing four lessons he has learned: always wear a seatbelt and don't speed; try everything, even if you think you can't do it because most of the time you'll discover you actually can do it after all; people who say you can't do something are actually helping you. It's up to you to prove them wrong! Value your family, friends and community because they are the ones who support you when things go wrong.

Sam and Jenny donated a copy of their book to each school they visited.

Comments from those attending included: "Sam puts things into perspective", his story was "captivating (and) presented with deep humanity", and that he delivered a "very positive message of resilience and strength".

Key supporters of these events were Northern Grampians and Central Goldfields Shire Councils, the Look Over the Farm Gate program, Agriculture Victoria and the Country Fire Authority.

Dunolly's flood plans finalised

Designs for a large-scale flood mitigation project in Dunolly have been completed, Central Goldfields Shire councillors have heard.

In a report tabled at last month's ordinary council meeting, general manager, technical services, David Sutcliffe, informed councillors of the plans to upgrade Dunolly's existing north east contour drain and associated retarding basin.

The plans are a result of the 2013/14 Dunolly Flood Study that identified key flooding issues in the town, determined flood levels for a range of flood events and recommended mitigation works to reduce the risk of future flooding, including the installation of a water gauge board.

The study report has identified a flood mitigation package, focused on upgrading and redefining the contour drain that runs through the forest area to the north east of the township to contain flows from the upstream eastern forest area," Mr Sutcliffe said.

"An upgrade of the existing retarding basin will slow those flows before discharge into Burnt Creek." he said.

The upgrade of the north east contour drain will require the existing drain to be reshaped and formed while the height of the bank of the basin located in Alice Street will also need to be increased to allow a storage capacity of 43 megalitres, the report detailed.

Councillors were also told that the inlet and outlet structures that control the inflow and outflows to the existing drain, which crosses the Dunolly-Eddington Road near the Betley Road intersection and discharges into Burnt Creek, will also need to be reconstructed.

Councillor John Van Beveren moved a motion that council note the progress report of the Dunolly Flood Mitigation Project and said it was nice to see council and residents move past the 2011 floods that hit the Central Goldfields.

"The striking outcome of this report is the changes of responsibility over periods of time which have resulted in a level of disregard concerning the construction and maintenance of waterways and catchments," he said.

"I'm glad to see things are moving on and hopefully after this, we will see works being done."

Estimated cost of the flood mitigation works is \$220,000, with the timing of construction dependent on the availability of funding.

The upgrade to the contour drain and retarding basin had the best benefit cost compared to other options, Mr Sutcliffe said,

"At this point there is no budget to begin this project, that's the next task to investigate going forward," Mr Sutcliffe said.

Councillor Bob Henderson seconded the progress report saying the works were unlikely to begin in the next 12 to 24 months.

"It's interesting to note the fact that this drain would have been built in the horse and buggy days. It's a brilliant piece of work but over the years it has become overgrown." Cr Henderson said.

Councillors unanimously agreed to note the progress report with council now to investigate funding options.





Dunolly footpath upgrade

Central Goldfields Shire has put up plans to improve facilities in Dunolly on the right path after councillors passed a new plan to construct footpaths leading to the township's preschool and caravan park.

Presenting a report to councillors at the ordinary council meeting on 23 August, Central Goldfields Shire Manager, Technical Services, David Sutcliffe said there were a number of streets in Dunolly without constructed footpaths.

"These works will be part of a rollout to improve facilities in Dunolly. These projects are best done in small steps and these are a part of that," Mr Sutcliffe said.

The instaling of footpaths in Thompson Street and Maude Street will provide access to the caravan park and local preschool and was listed as a priority by local residents, Mr Sutcliffe's report found:

"There are not many footpaths in all. It really is limited to the main street," Mr Sutcliffe told the meeting.

Councillor John Van Beveren moved the motion to endorse the proposed plans for the footpath works and said it was "money well spent."

"Given that this money is going towards our assets in townships like Dunolly, it is important," he said.

"Giving appropriate access for our elderly, disabled and senior citizens is very important."

Seconding the motion, councillor Bob Henderson commented on the importance of having a footpath leading to the caravan park, stating the park is 90 percent full most of the year.

"A lot of people do stay in the caravan park and there are no footpaths whatsoever between there and the main street," Cr Henderson said.

The Flynn Ward councillor also told the meeting that the current path is in a state of disrepair and forces pedestrians to walk along the road, adding that the situation needs to be overcome.

"Pedestrians nave no other option than to walk along the road because if they walk along the side of the street, they may well trip and break their neck," Cr Henderson said

Councillor Henderson also stressed the importance of having a concrete path leading to the local preschool as it would improve the safety of local children.

"Especially in the warmer months, parents want their kids to walk or ride to school. They currently have to do that on the road. We want to get them off the road and onto the footpath," Cr Henderson said.

Following the installation of the proposed footpaths, Mr Sutcliffe suggested the next step for Dunolly would be a footpath to the senior citizens' club.

A sum of \$135,000 has been allocated in the 2016/17 council budget for footpath upgrades in Dunolly, with works to begin early next year.

The motion was unanimously carried by councillors.






