Dunolly District Hospital Auxiliary Nursing Scholarship 2019

The Dunolly District Hospital Auxiliary is offering a scholarship of \$1000 to a resident of Dunolly or the surrounding district. The successful recipient must be studying in an area of nursing.

The study program can be one of the following:

- ◆ A Registered Nurse undertaking postgraduate studies.
- ♦ An Enrolled Nurse studying towards obtaining a Registered Nurse or specialised nursing qualification.
- ◆ A resident who is studying towards obtaining an Enrolled Nurse or Registered Nurse qualification and has successfully completed at least one year of study.
- ◆ A Registered Nurse or Enrolled Nurse who is seeking assistance to undertake or complete a course of workrelated study or to attend a work-related conference.

Criteria for selection:

- Must be a resident of Dunolly or the surrounding district.
- Must be enrolled in one of the education programs above.
- Mature aged applicants are encouraged to apply.
- The applicant must not have received any other financial assistance prior to the application.

How Many Scholarships?

The selection committee may decide to award the annual amount to either one person, or divide it between a number of applicants.

The selection committee may decide not to award a scholarship.

How to Apply:

The applicant is to write a letter describing how he or she meets the criteria above. In the application, there must be proof of the enrolment actually having been approved. Applications must be submitted by 25th October 2019 via post to:

Questions raised over Dunolly rail services

The State Government's \$130 million plan to upgrade the Ballarat line which was expected to boost local services has come under fire.

Revealed prior to the 2018 state election, the plan included the Freight Passenger Rail Separation Project which was set to deliver a number of track and signalling improvements not included in the Murray Basin Rail Project, as well as providing the infrastructure to support a boost in passenger rail on the Maryborough line and allow the return of passenger rail to Dunolly.

The project included converting existing broad-gauge track between Ballarat and Maryborough to dual gauge, enabling future passenger rail to Dunolly by retaining the dual gauge connections between Maryborough and Dunolly and creating separate paths for passenger and freight lines, including Maryborough services.

The then Minister for Public Transport, Jacinta Allan, announced the project during a visit to Maryborough in July last year and although she did not provide a timeline for when passenger services would begin in Dunolly, said a final timeline would be released.

Member for Ripon Louise Staley and Shadow Minister for Metropolitan Public Transport and Transport Infrastructure David Davis were in Dunolly last week and expressed concerns over the government's "radio silence" on the plan.

"Prior to the 2018 state election, both the government and ourselves made commitments around this line and we said we'd return passenger trains all the way to Donald and would restore the Dunolly station as part of that," Ms Staley said.

"To make that project work, it requires the line from Maryborough to Ballarat to be standardised. The government announced they'd standardise the line between Maryborough and Ballarat as part of their Freight Passenger Separation Project which was separate from the botched Murray Basin Rail Project.

"We haven't heard anything about this \$130 million project; it's meant to be completed in 2020 and we're now in October 2019."

Ms Staley said it's concerning that the community, particularly the community of Dunolly, have heard no word on the project given its looming deadline.

"Not only did the State Government make those announcements around the line between Maryborough and Ballarat, they explicitly said the project paved the way to return passenger services to Dunolly, there was a clear expectation by the community in Dunolly that whoever won the election, they were going to get passenger services," she said.

"In August I asked about this in parliament and Ms Allan had 30 days to respond and she hasn't. This is a big project and it takes time. When can the people of Dunolly expect to see their passenger rail service?"

Mr Davis said there's a concern the funding has been reprioritised.

"There's been radio silence; nothing has been seen or heard about this and I think many are fearful this has dropped off the agenda, that the government has taken the money and re-prioritised it for large city projects," he said. "If that's not the case, we need to hear from the minister when that \$130 million project starts and when it will finish. They need to come clean on what's happened to that money and when they're going to start."

While the now Minister for Public Transport Melissa Horne did not respond to questions on the timeline of upgrades at Dunolly and the return of passenger rail to the town, she said works are continuing on the Ballarat line.

"While the Liberals continue to talk down regional rail, we're investing half a billion dollars in the Ballarat Line to deliver more frequent and reliable service," she said.

"We are also adding more VLocity carriages to the Ballarat line, providing more seats on the busiest services."



Good Fishing

What started as a way to decrease the number of carp in Little Lake Boort and to potentially increase the number of edible fish, has turned into a fantastic, fun weekend for the entire family.

"More than anything we wanted to get people fishing," Rod Stringer, the President of the Boort Angling Club, explains. "Keeping carp out of the lake was a bonus. Three years ago, we had around 100 people enter for the weekend, and then last year we had over 230. We are hoping for even greater numbers this year."

Whilst there are a few serious fishermen in the group each year, Rod says that it's wonderful to see first-timers and

kids having a go.

"Little Lake Boort is a wonderful lake in beautiful surrounds. It really is one of the town's greatest assets and it's a fantastic place to sit on the grass around the water and just relax. It's



free for kids to enter and we've had a few little ones, even as young as three or four, have a go. With no steep drop-off at any part of the lake, it's safe and makes fishing easy."

With a number of prizes available over the weekend – some based on skill, and some based on luck – there is an opportunity for everyone to win. "You might not win on the fishing, but you've a chance to win on something else," Rod says.

"We do our best to cater for everyone. We encourage people to come along and have a look."

So come along on the weekend of 19th and 20th October. Entry for the weekend is \$50 per family or \$25 per adult with kids under 16 free. The entry fee includes breakfast on both Saturday and Sunday, dinner on Saturday evening and entry to a major prize draw.

Wedderburn Open Gardens

At our meeting held last week, there were several issues addressed. Central Goldfields Shire Chief Administrator, Noel Harvey also attended the meeting and answered questions from members on a variety of matters.

Discussion took place on our recent meeting with Mr Harvey regarding the concerns of some community members on the downgrading of the Aerodrome to Aircraft Landing Area status, also in regard to the ongoing construction of the fence designed to prevent kangaroos on the runway. Mr Harvey has stated that the decision will not be rescinded.

Mr Harvey advised on the status of the proposed Carisbrook flood levy; Council are awaiting an independent valuation on a recently-purchased property and are hopeful of a planning permit application being received within the next month.

Some other discussions ensued on the second draft of the Property Occupancy Policy, recycling, compost, the application for a third pharmacy and also the Challenge of the Bands next April; this is expected to attract around 25,000 visitors to Maryborough.

The closing date for submissions on the Property Occupancy Policy is 31st October, with a hearing for those who wish to speak to their submissions, on 13th November. The second draft has been simplified and has taken many of the original community concerns into account. It is important to have your say, so that the final draft can be tailored to further meet the requirements of relevant groups within the community.

Our next meeting is to be held on Tuesday 12th November at 7.30pm at the Senior Citizens Hall, Urquhart St., Carisbrook. Please note that only for this month it is deferred to the second Tuesday, due to Melbourne Cup Day.

Events that occur in one's life which are highly dramatic or disastrous at the time, can be looked back on later and you can usually see the funny side. My life has always been fraught with dramas and disasters, but I am pretty good at weathering the storm and blundering into the next one.

I would rate my hospital mistake on top of the list. I recently had a knee replacement at St. John of God in Ballarat and was at the gym stage where I hobbled on crutches for short distances when not being wheeled around. This day one of the nurses helped me to the toilet door and told me to push the button when ready to leave. I looked around and saw a red button which I could just reach and pressed it. Then all hell broke loose. The door was flung open, doctors and nurses came running from other floors. "Where's the emergency?" they cried. Yes, I had pushed the emergency button instead of the one beside the toilet. Of course I hid behind the door so no one would find out who did it.

One little faux pas of mine was closer to home. I drove into the Council car park for the first time after it had been constructed, and when I got back in the car to exit, seeing the arrow to drive right around, and seeing that the car space opposite was empty, I drove straight ahead. Bang, crunch - I hadn't noticed the concrete kerbing which separated the parking rows, and my little car could not summon the energy to back off the concrete ridge. So I had to go back in to call the RACV and then in walked the then-ranger, Jane Edwards, who said to the receptionist "Some idiot has got stuck on the kerbing in the car park". When I put my hand up, Jane, who knew me, offered not to take a photo for the paper for \$50. At least we could laugh. I have written before of my gearstick disasters; the one in Paris when I had to drive back to the ferry to go home when the gears stuck in second gear and we miraculously found a garage before a worse disaster happened. The other one was when I borrowed my sister-in-law's car when staying in Sydney, and the gearstick came off in my hand. Imagine me walking into the kitchen and handing Dale her gearstick. That, however was by the far the least of my Sydney disasters. On another occasion I was staying with Dale and my brother, Robert, during the holidays along with my three kids. Dale received a phone call with bad news and they both had to rush over to Dale's parents, leaving me in charge of the children; who included their small son, my three, and two neighbour friends who had come to swim in the pool.

I put the jug on to have a cup of tea to bolster me up for the coming ordeal of pool supervision while the kids organised themselves. Next thing they are all in the water, so I went out and forgot the jug. By the time I returned, the jug, which was plastic had turned into a strange looking lump and had burnt a hole in the laminex bench - the forerunners of automatic jugs and granite benches. To top it all, one of the kids had flopped down on the banana lounge and snapped it in two. I had locked the German Shepherd in the garage and when released, I discovered he had chewed the upholstery in the seats of my brother's boat. Thank goodness my relatives are easy going and we were invited back.



Council endorses \$2 million Gordon Gardens Masterplan



The final draft of the Gordon Gardens Masterplan has been endorsed by the Central Goldfields Shire Council and will likely be implemented over a period of 10 or more years, at a cost of more than \$2 million.

Endorsed at last month's ordinary council meeting, the masterplan has undergone significant community consultation since it was first endorsed by council last year. Developed by Michael Smith and Associates in conjunction with community consultation, the masterplan report presented to council last month included 31 key directions, a list of realistic strategies and actions.

These include the removal of three tennis courts to be converted to a grassed area, the upgrade of one court and the conversion of another to a combined basketball and netball court, set to start this year with close to \$30,000 in funding from Regional Development Victoria for the project. Other changes include alterations to car parking, additional trees, footpaths, a ramp at the Barkly Street entrance to the bowls club, the installation of irrigated grassed areas, the removal of a skate park, additional seats throughout the garden and the installation of barbecue areas.

The development of the masterplan was included in the shire's 2018/19 budget and \$25,000 is included in this year's budget to further implement the plan.

According to the report tabled to council, full implementation of the plan will likely be staged over 10 or more years at an estimated cost of \$2 million, however council has stated it will seek external funding as it becomes available.

Central Goldfields Shire administrator Karen Douglas described the community consultation process for the masterplan as "lengthy" but said it's an "exciting piece of work".

"There's been a considerable amount of consultation that's gone into this plan so I'd like to particularly thank the community of Dunolly for their input," she said.

"There have been various opportunities, we've had a public meeting, several workshops, we had the draft on display, there were submissions and comments made and it's very much had a great acceptance in the town of Dunolly.

"The school children were very involved and got very enthusiastic about this and I thought that was really great — this is their future that we're actually designing here."

The Gordon Gardens Masterplan and report will be available for the public to view on council's website and hard copies will be made available at Dunolly's Rural Transaction Centre.

"I'd encourage people who haven't seen the plan at this stage to please have a look at it because I think this is quite an exciting piece of work," Ms Douglas said.





Kicking goals for women and girls in Western Victoria


