After a walk around the infant garden and an attempt to identify some mystery fruitless fruit trees, we all enjoyed a delicious home-baked afternoon tea provided by Colleen and Rod in their comfy caravan, out of the cold wind.

We are all looking forward to following Colleen and Rod on their building and gardening journey. I'm sure there will be lots of advice and ideas forthcoming!

New look for Bills Water Trough

Council has recently undertaken the job of brightening up some of the Bills Water Troughs across the Shire. The troughs were part of the legacy of George Bills, who passed away in 1927. His wife Annis had predeceased him by several years. George left the bulk of his estate to establish a Trust for the welfare of animals. The most visible memorial to this legacy was the manufacture and installation of around 700 of these troughs in Australia and 50 overseas. They are inscribed "Donated by Annis and George Bills, Australia". While these new coats of paint have freshened the troughs, it would be nice to see them planted with something colourful, as can be seen in some other towns.

Debt collection

The Central Goldfields Shire has decided not to pursue former CEO Mark Johnston's debt to the shire. This decision was not made at a council meeting. Administrator Noel Harvey is quoted in *The Maryborough Advertiser* of 15th February as saying the cost of solicitors and barristers would be more than we would get. This totally disregards that the debt has already been proved in court and that the winner can claim costs. Two facts already known.

Point one of the Shire's own Debt Collection Policy is "to ensure all debts owed to council are paid". This and the seven other objectives in the policy are being ignored. The policy also states "accounts in excess of \$1,000...will be recovered through court proceedings". The legal expenses are not covered by this policy so to use legal costs as an excuse not to prosecute is contradicting council policy.

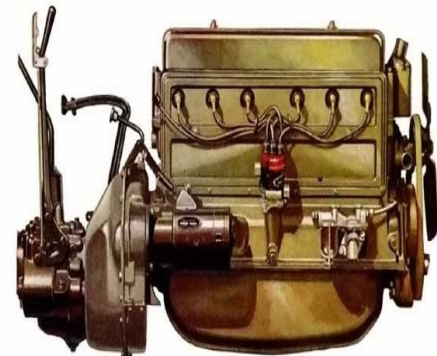

Gordon Gardens Community Consultation session

The Dunolly community is invited to have their say on the Gordon Gardens Masterplan and meet the consultant team at an upcoming community workshop.

The workshop will be held on Wednesday 3 April from 7 to 9pm at the Dunolly Town Hall, Broadway.

The Masterplan will outline areas of future development for Gordon Gardens.

Draft Rating Strategy feedback invited

Central Goldfields Shire Council has endorsed the Draft Rating Strategy 2019-2021 and is now seeking community feedback.

Council's current Rating Strategy was adopted in 2014.

The Draft Rating Strategy 2019-2021 is a technical document that explores four potential options to determine the rate amount for property owners and Council has endorsed its preferred option.

Council's preferred option aims to simplify the rating system, improve equity between ratepayers, comply with the proposed changes to the Local Government Act and minimise the annual impact on each property.

The preferred option proposes two key changes to the current Rating Strategy – the municipal charge to be reduced from 17.7% of total rates collected down to 10.0%, and the geographic split of Maryborough/Non-Maryborough in the residential, commercial and farm land differential rates to be removed.

Any changes to the Rating Strategy mean that some people will pay more and some people will pay less, it does not have any impact in the amount of rates collected by Council.

It is proposed that the reduction of the municipal charge will be phased in over three years and the removal of the Maryborough/Non-Maryborough differential will be phased in over five years.

A copy of the Draft Rating Strategy 2019-2021 is available on Council's website.

Residents are invited to have their say on the Draft Rating Strategy through a formal submission process and via an online survey at www.centralgoldfields.vic.gov.au/haveyoursay

Written submissions and survey responses must be made by Monday 1 April, 2019. Written submissions should be addressed to Submissions, Central Goldfields Shire Council, PO Box 194, Maryborough, 3465 or emailed to submissions@cgoldshire.vic.gov.au

If you make a submission and wish to speak to it you must specify that you wish to do so as part of your submission. A submission hearing will be held on Tuesday 9 April at 5.30pm at the Community Hub with the public encouraged to attend.

Central Goldfields Shire Chief Administrator Noel Harvey said the Draft Rating Strategy will help to reduce confusion surrounding rates.

"Rates and how they are levied is complex and our Draft Rating Strategy aims to maximise equality and simplicity, whilst minimising the annual impact of the proposed changes on property owners."

Funding announcement welcomed

It was fantastic to receive the news that the Our Region, Our Rivers project joint infrastructure project was successful in gaining funding from the Federal Regional Growth Fund.

Council very much welcomes this funding announcement from the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development Michael McCormack.

On behalf of Council, I'd also like to recognise and thank Swan Hill Rural City Council, who coordinated the significant amount of work that went into the joint funding application. This application involved the Swan Hill, Gannawarra, Buloke and Loddon councils from Victoria and Balranald, Murray River and Edward River councils in NSW.

Loddon's share of the funding is more than \$760,000, which will help deliver over \$1.5 million worth of works. This funding will enable Council to undertake significant redevelopment of three of its caravan parks in Pyramid Hill, Boort and Wedderburn, and implement Stage 2 of the Bridgewater Foreshore project. It will see new caravan park facilities such as amenities blocks, entrance upgrades, improvements to some cabins and powerheads, water and sullage points. These long-awaited improvements are expected to increase tourism patronage and use of short-term accommodation in Pyramid Hill, Boort and Wedderburn, increasing overnight stays in our towns and bringing wider economic benefits to those communities and the broader region.

The Bridgewater Foreshore Project will deliver new and upgraded infrastructure that is accessible, easily maintained and safe, including seating areas and shelters, community gathering spaces, pathways, interpretive/cultural signage and improved access points to the foreshore. The Bridgewater Foreshore precinct is a popular destination for the local community and visitors alike and these improvements will make this area even better to visit and spend more time enjoying.

Food and Wine Expo success

I'd like to congratulate the Loddon Southern Development and Tourism Committee on the very successful Loddon Valley Food and Wine Expo on 16 March. The feedback from the day, particularly those who attended the River Feast luncheon, has been very positive. The expo not only had a good turnout of locals, but visitors from across Victoria. As I have previously highlighted, the day was a fantastic opportunity to showcase the amazing array of local producers within the Loddon Valley, and to put a spotlight on our Loddon Shire overall.

I'd like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the amazing work of the Loddon Southern Development and Tourism Committee. The committee oversaw the Loddon Valley Food and Wine Expo from its concept through to the staging of the event.

The expo was also made possible through funding, including from Regional Development Victoria (\$50,000), Inglewood and Districts Community Bank, and Council, as well as other sponsorship and in-kind support, such as the many volunteers that helped the day run smoothly.

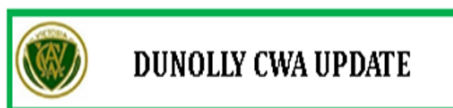
Golden Triangle Archers' members are having a working bee this Sunday 31st March. They will be refilling target butts, sorting out targets and generally having a bit of a clean up.

Wirework Workshop on Sunday 7th April

Regina Dudek is coming to teach a workshop at the Arts Hub on Sunday 7th April at 11am. She will be sharing her knowledge on the art of wirework in a three-hour workshop. Regina Dudek has been creating whimsical wire and metal sculptures for the last 20 years. She draws inspiration from everyday items often deemed well past their use-by date. Where others see junk, Regina senses beauty and a rich history expressed within decay and decline. Participants will be constructing a free-form birdcage in the workshop; all materials supplied. I recently spoke to Regina about the workshop and she is very excited to be coming up to this area. She also said that if you had any old jewellery, keys, pressed tin, metal treasures, chandelier crystals, pre-loved jewellery, buttons, rusting wire, odd cutlery, battered pressed metal, old tapestries, lace and even embroideries that you would like to incorporate into the birdcage, please bring them along. Regina's construction methods are unapologetically low-tech and all carried out by hand; binding and twisting wire, riveting and gluing. If you have ever been up to Castlemaine's 'Shades of Grey' you will have seen the types of work you can achieve with the skill of wire working. 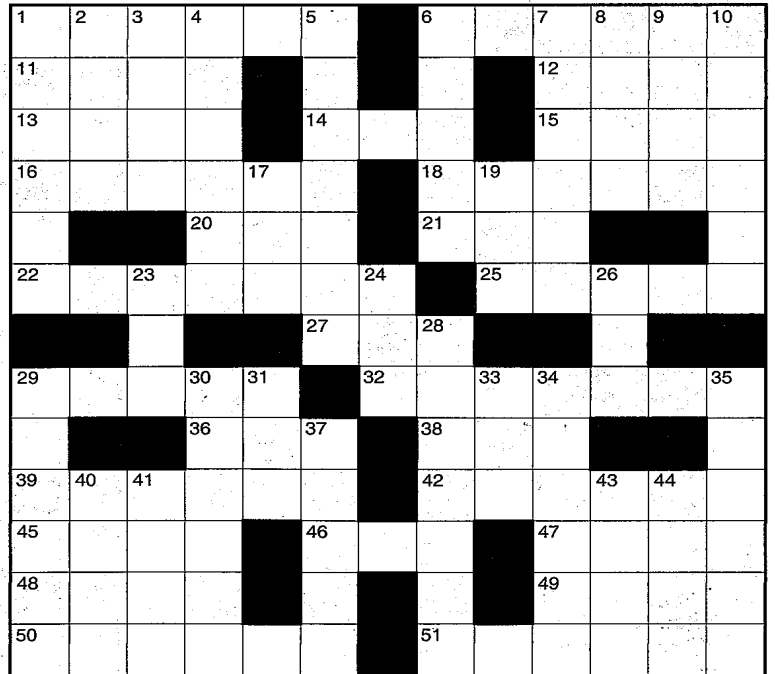

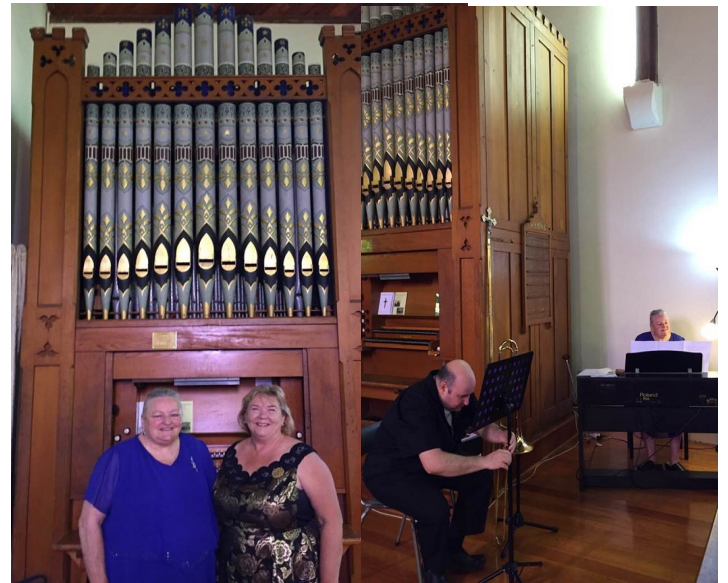
